# CanAssist is a Canadian charity funding infrastructure development in East Africa



#### **Health Care**

CanAssist provides funding for health-related infrastructure projects that support hospitals and clinics and improve the quality of basic health care. Examples include providing hospital beds and water tanks, and funding building enhancements such as solar panels and security fencing

#### **Water Sanitation**

As basic human rights (United Nations 2010), clean water and sanitation are essential for preventing illness and death, and improving health, social and economic conditions. CanAssist supports access to clean water by working with communities to install bore holes and water catchment tanks, and has initiated irrigation systems needed to grow food. CanAssist supports sanitation by helping build latrines and other facilities, particularly in schools.



#### **Education**

A right under the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and a social determinate of health, education is a key focus area for CanAssist funding through infrastructure projects. CanAssist has supported the building of classrooms, schools, support structures, teacher accommodations and sports and has provided books, other basic school supplies, and furniture.

At the end of 2021 we were carrying more cash in the banks than usual, due to the year-end generosity of regular donors and a specific donation from a Foundation. In 2022 we used this nest-egg by boosting spending by over \$50k from the year before and this "overspending" is reflected in the bottom line. As a result we still have a positive cash balance.

# 2022 CanAssist African Relief Trust Project Manager's Report

The year 2022 was a busy one for CanAssist. Through long established relationships and new collaborations we continue to make a measurable impact in East Africa. At the end of each calendar year I have the pleasure of summarizing the previous year's work. I am always amazed at what we have been able to accomplish. Furthermore, I take pride in knowing that 95 cents of your donation dollar goes directly to African communities. Your ongoing financial support means that we can continue to build schools, fund latrines and water catchment and provide essential support to medical clinics. Together, we CanAssist!

I am very pleased to share that last year we funded infrastructure projects in the amount of more than \$200,000. These include 3 new classrooms, 1 school kitchen, 3 fuel efficient wood burning stoves, 10 latrines, 6 water tanks and guttering, 4 borehole wells, 1 security gate, 7 handwash/hygiene stations, a rural maternity unit, and many classroom desks, textbooks, and computers. Clearly the proof of our impact can be found in these numbers.

I also had the good fortune to visit many of these projects in Kenya and Uganda during the winter of 2022. The projects were constructed well and were benefitting communities in multiple ways.





This support in the areas of education, water, health and hygiene have benefitted many women, children, families and extended communities. Not only do people benefit directly from a new school or a new well, for example, but by utilizing local labour and materials, CanAssist provides economic support as well. In essence, your money goes a long way to improving the lives of whole communities.

If you are interested in our work, there continues to be need for new water projects, new schools, medical clinic support and basic hygiene. We hope to continue to provide support, and through your kindness, we will be able to continue this work together.

#### CanAssist founder, John Geddes, visits CanAssist Projects in Kenya in 2022

During my time as Director of the CanAssist African Relief Trust, one of my greatest pleasures was visiting project sites and meeting many East Africans, some of whom became good friends. Although I am no longer a CanAssist trustee, I had the privilege of returning to Kenya in September 2022 to catch up with many of them.



During my 2022 trip, I spent most of my time in Nyanza Province, near Kisumu, where CanAssist has several active and proposed project partners. Together with Daniel Otieno, CanAssist's field representative, I visited several schools, met with students and staff, and checked on completed projects while learning about upcoming needs. Dan also signed memorandum of agreement papers with school officials, and I had the honor of

bringing greetings from CanAssist trustees and many donors to students, teachers, and community members. I am delighted to report that CanAssist continues to be a responsible andhelpful partner in many East African communities,

providing funding and oversight for sustainable infrastructure projects while creating economic benefits for communities by hiring workers and buying materialslocally.
